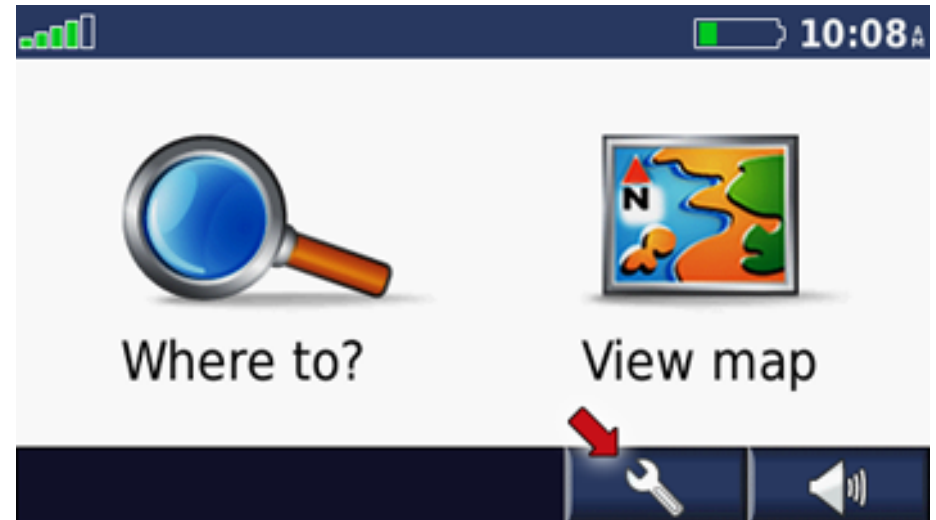

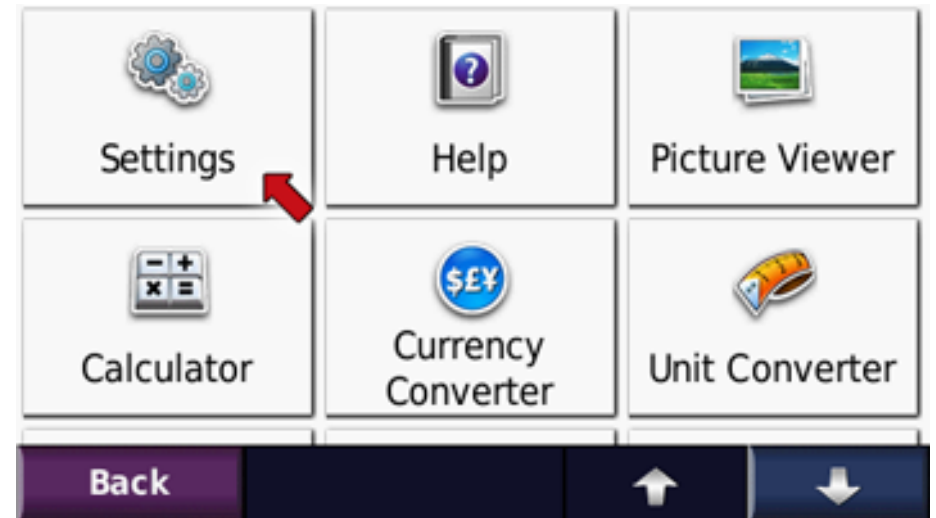
Map Usage For Nuvi / Zumo Series

(Colorado and Oregon will be similar)

1) Tap the wrench icon.



2) Tap "Settings."



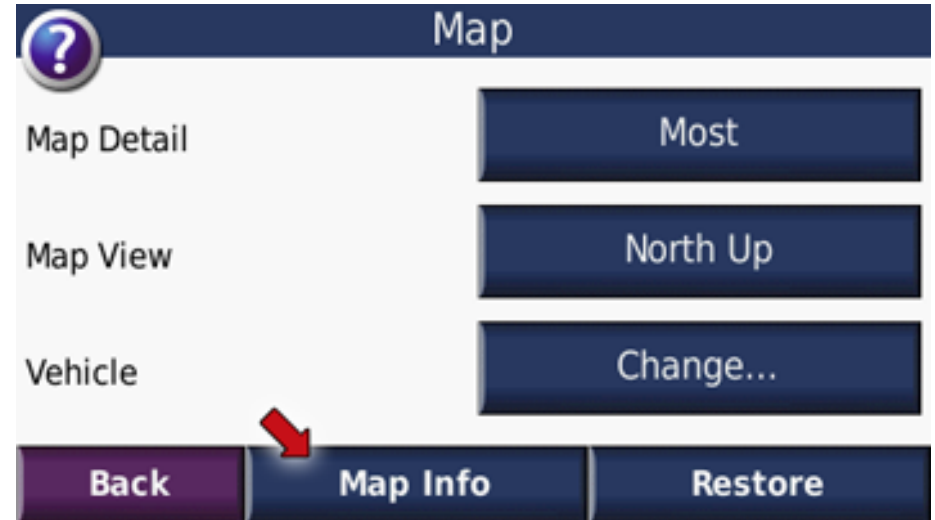
3) Tap the down arrow to scroll down.



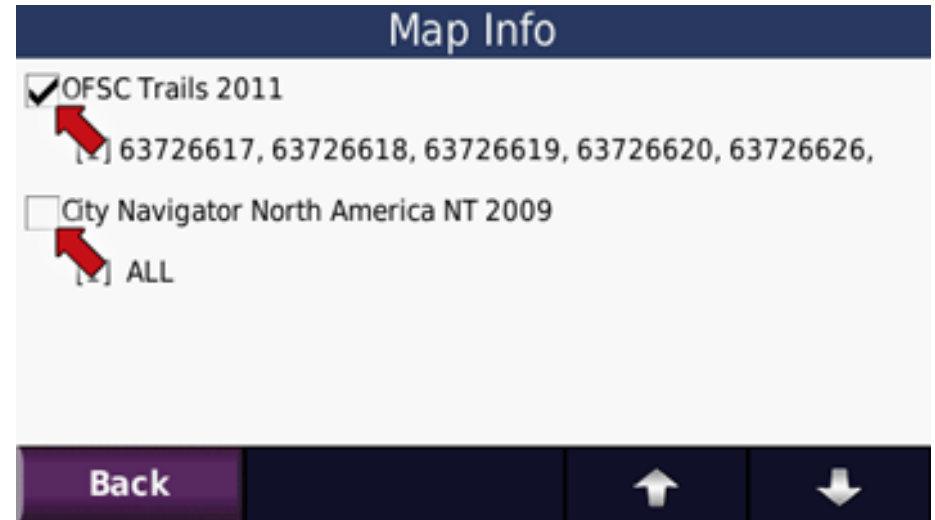
4) Tap "Map"



5) Tap "Map Info."



6) Check the box for your Red Pine Mapping map, and uncheck all other maps.

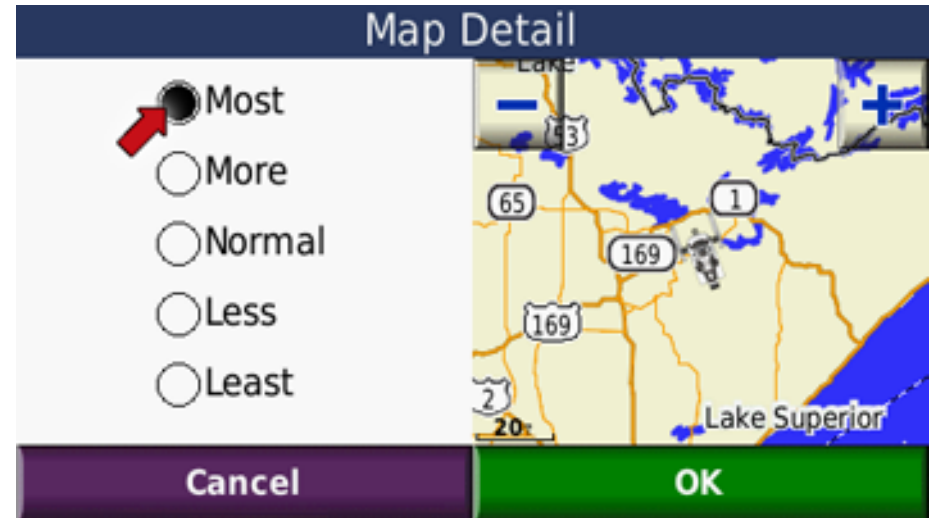


7) Tap "Back" then the "Map Detail" button.

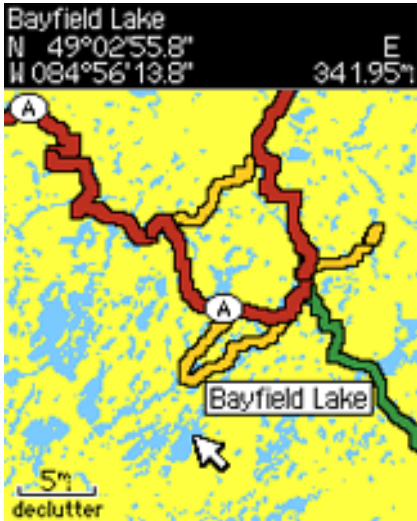


8) Tap "Most". This will give you the best viewing experience.

You may now tap "Back" all the way out until you see "View Map". Tap "View Map" and you will see your Red Pine Mapping map appear when you're in the area the map covers and zoomed in enough.



Map Usage For Etrex Series, 60, 76, Rino,
and other handhelds



1) From the map screen, press the Menu button.



2) Select "Setup Map".



3) On this screen, press the Menu button again.



4) You will see a list of installed maps. Hide all of them and show the Red Pine Mapping map. If a map says "Show" it will not be visible.

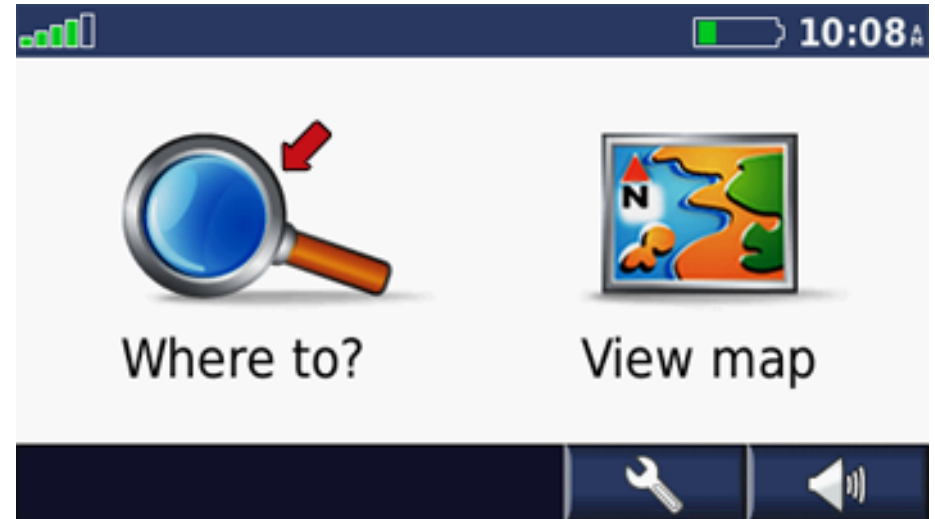


5) In the "Map Setup" menu under "General", set Detail to "Most."

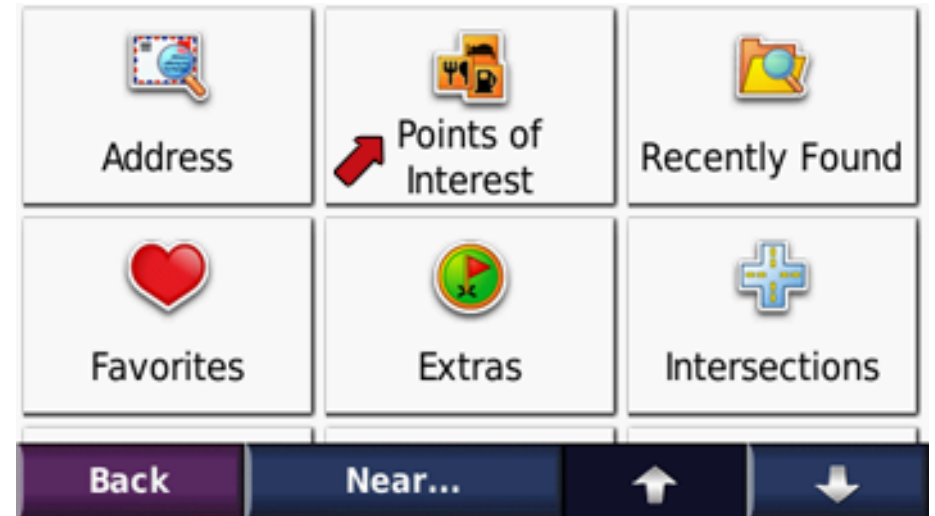
Routing Instructions For Nuvi / Zumo Series

(Colorado and Oregon will be similar)

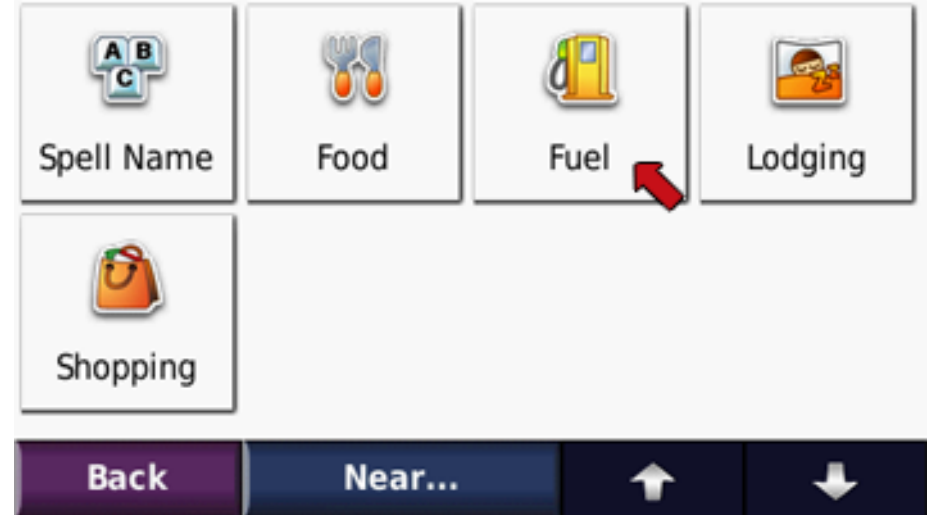
1) Tap "Where to?"



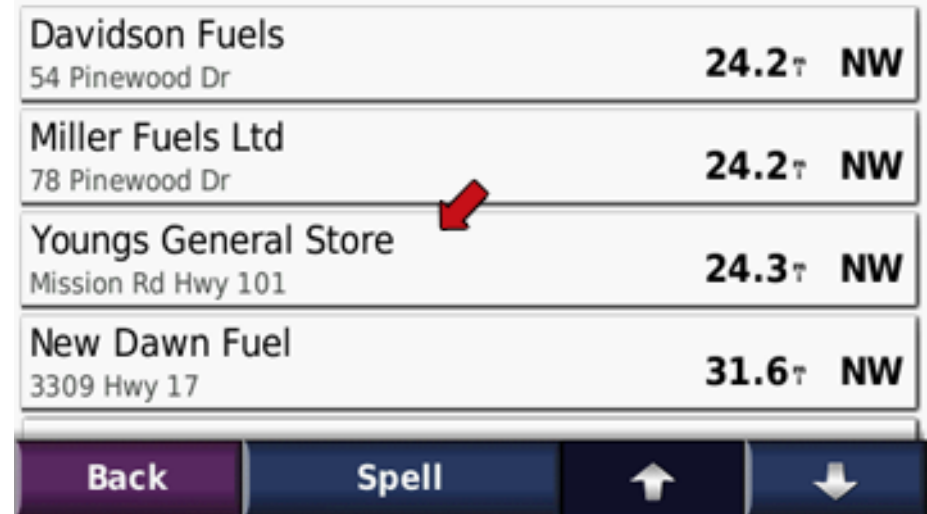
2) Tap "Points of Interest"



3) Tap your desired category of destination - in this example, we show routing to a gas station.

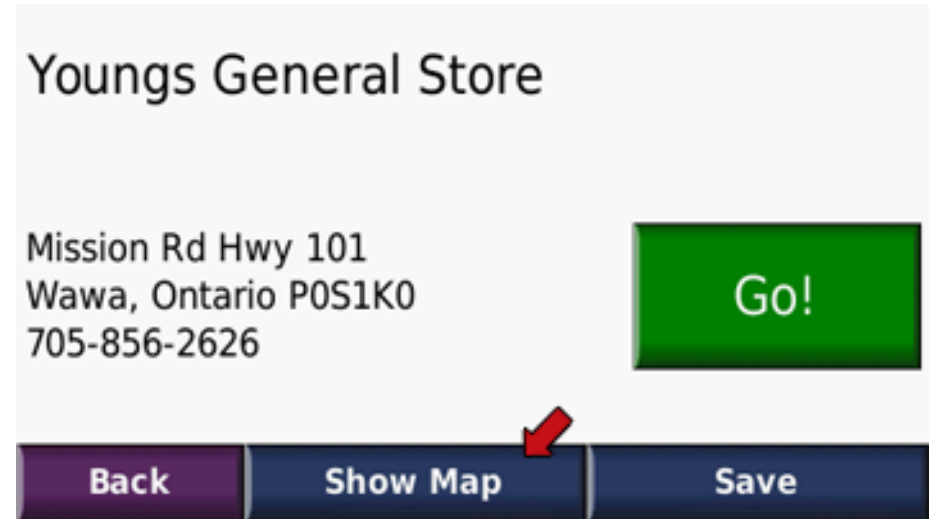


4) Tap your desired destination. You may already know the specific destination you want to go to, or you can choose based on distance from your current location.

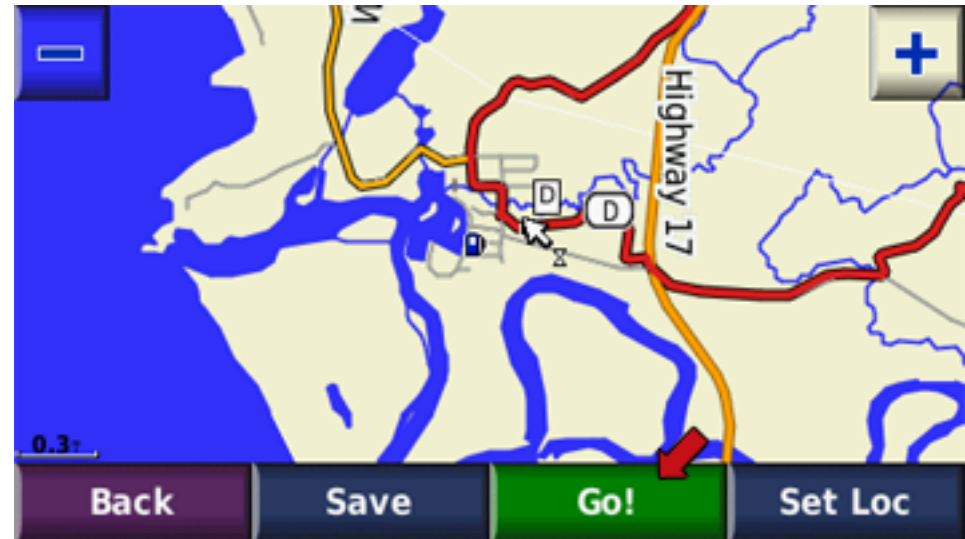


5) Tap "Show Map"

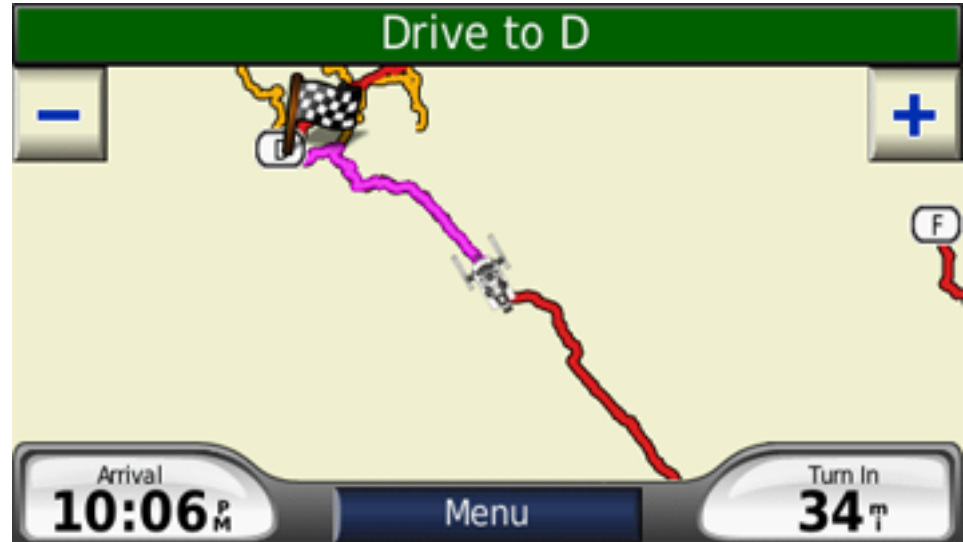
We recommend calling ahead to any destination to confirm hours of operation and snowmobile accessibility.



6) Tap the trail very close to your destination. This will create an on-trail destination point.



7) Follow the turn-by-turn directions guiding you to your on-trail destination!



NOTES: For routing to work, you need to be very near a trail. If the GPS draws a straight line between your routing points, it's due to one or more of them being too far from a trail. Only the trails are routable, so you will not be routed on any roads. Not all available Points of Interest (POI) will be easily accessible, so it's up to the user to determine if a POI is suitable for snowmobile travel. Leave the GPS set to either "Fastest Route" or "Shortest Route" and not "Off-Road."

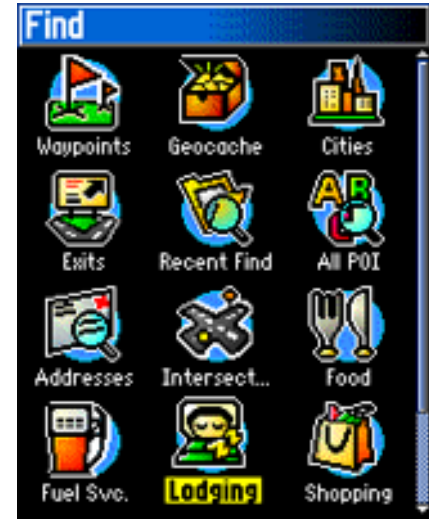

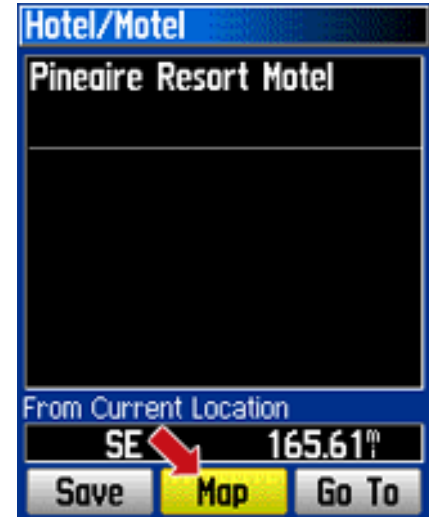
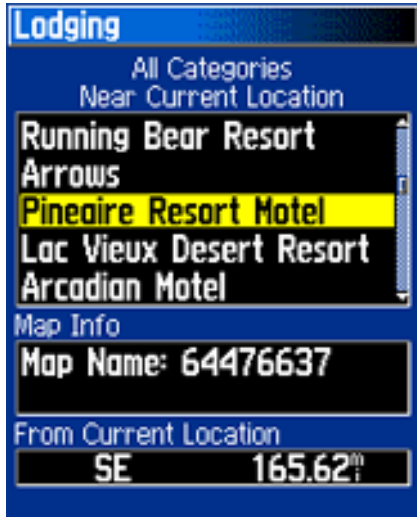
1) From the Main Menu screen, select Find.

2) Select your desired category of destination. In this example, we show routing to a motel.



3) Select your desired destination. You may already know the specific destination you want to go to, or you can choose based on distance from your current location.

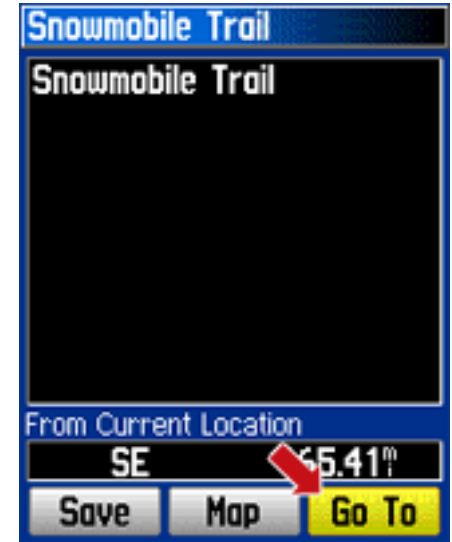
4) Click "Map" We recommend calling ahead to any destination to confirm hours of operation and snowmobile accessibility.





6) Click the trail very close to your destination. This will create an on-trail destination point.

7) Click "Go To"
Follow the turn-by-turn directions guiding you to your on-trail destination!
